This book provides useful information for all investigators trying to deepen their understanding of colorectal

cancer and develop evidence-based therapeutic strategies.

Harmer (TNM Classification of Malignant Tumours, 1978). This was all the more important since publication

of the Booklet was followed in 1980 by publication of a Brochure of Checklists, edited by A.H.

Of these patients, about 50% will develop liver metastases and approximately 20% will present a stage IV disease at diagnosis.
